

Parental information – continuation of your child’s learning when they are accessing their lessons remotely

As you will be aware, the government have provided schools with clear guidelines to support the management of Covid-19 in our school and the community and on occasions we might need to ask groups of children to access their learning remotely. This would mean that they will learn from home one week followed by a week of in-school learning.

We have set out clear guidelines of our expectations of pupils and staff to allow for the continuation of learning when pupils are remote working. Your child has been made aware of these expectations and we would appreciate it if you could support your child in adhering to them.

What are the school’s expectations for learning remotely?

What will your child’s teachers do?	What will your child need to do?
Invite your child to their normal timetabled lesson, via Microsoft Teams	Join the lesson which their teacher has invited them to – timings of lessons will be the same as if your child was in school
Teacher will take a register	Your child will need to be present, unless they are not well, which you will need to have communicated to our attendance officer
Teacher will provide approximately 15 minutes live or pre-recorded teaching to support the learning planned for the lesson	Your child should listen carefully and ask any questions they have about the learning at this point
Teacher will set independent learning for your child to demonstrate their knowledge and skills	Your child should engage fully in the learning, completing any learning tasks in the format their teacher has requested e.g. OneNote, LbQ, Microsoft Forms assessments etc.
Teacher might leave the Teams call whilst your child is completing their learning to allow your child to fully focus.	If your child has any questions and the teacher has left the Teams call, they can post the question in their class Team. The teacher will respond as soon as they are able to.

As your child will be following his or her usual in-school timetable, at the end of each lesson, your child should either wait for the next lesson to start or take a morning break or lunch break, depending on the time in the day.
